This is a letter sent to our congregational leaders from our District head, Rev. Kenn Hurto. He writes a monthly letter, dealing with pertinent issues that face us locally, as well as nationally. I was especially touched by his discussion of faith development, of our 4th Principle, encouraging spiritual growth in our congregations, ways to take our own spiritual growth measure. I would like to share his article with you:

Dear Companions,

In our last issue, I raised with you the question of **growth in our Unitarian Universalist congregations**. I argued for the importance of **numbers** as a measure: that each number represents a human being eager to be part of our faith community. I remarked also that our numbers are not so good (down to 4,888 after our UUA January certification reports were filed). We ought to notice whether we are serving more or fewer people. I urge you to open the conversation in your congregation about how we can grow our faith in this time.

I promised to speak of other ways to think about growth. Here's one for you: **How would you measure whether or not you and your fellow congregants are more or less mature religiously?** Our 4th Principles says part of our purpose is to encourage "*spiritual growth in our congregations*." How would you know if your congregation is doing that?

We speak of Faith Development as a life-span work. Each stage of life has new questions, or old questions that open to a deeper understanding. We should be growing! The constellation of hopes and beliefs that serve well for a child are inadequate to the young adult, let alone a senior. My hunch, though, is that trying to come up with a congregation-wide metric of spiritual growth would be either impossible or meaningless. Yet, I do think each of us could take our own measure. Some questions to consider:

- What have I learned about myself this year that guides me toward joyful living?
- What do I understand differently about the "big" questions of life: the nature of the holy, my sense of purpose and meaning, my ability to connect with others?
- Can I articulate my core values in a positive way?
- Would my "elevator speech" [tell a stranger what you truly believe in 3 minutes] be compelling? Am I confident I could do it? Have I tried?
- Have I grown in service to others? Do I walk my talk as a Unitarian Universalist, respecting others, working for justice, and so on?
- Am I a more loving human being?

Well, the list could get lengthy. What would you add were you to do **an annual survey of your spiritual growth**? For me, the answer has something to do with my daily prayer: "*Thank you,*" and "*May I not knowingly add harm to our world.*" Put differently, I measure my spiritual evolution by being ever more grateful for life and whether or not I can do something every day to make life a little better, or at least not make things worse. It is a spiritual discipline. What's yours? How are you growing spiritually?

Finally, I wanted to mention that SC had "An Evening of Science and Soul" where I talked on Anthropogenic (man-made) Global Warming (AGW) followed by a wonderful presentation by the talented Jim Scott that my co-chair, Dawn Foster, arranged. Everyone seemed to enjoy the mix of creativity and playfulness shown that was a real stress reliever. Gary also submitted the following editorial comments:

The health care "reform" continues as of today with President Obama pushing the one the Senate passed. Republicans charged that this bill is a radical break from our existing system- a big socialist undertaking. In reality, this bill is anything but a break from the past. Doctor salaries aren't affected. Hospitals aren't affected much and neither are pharmaceuticals. One of the big winners is health insurance companies that would get subsidies along with government penalties against those who are poor, or who decide to opt out of buying private insurance. The situation is dire with both major parties making things worse by pushing for something that isn't reform, or ignoring systemic problems with the hope of grabbing back seats in 2010 Congressional elections.

Another issue is the Robert's court ruling (5-4) that kills campaign finance reform by claiming that it's infringing on the rights of corporations. Of course, campaign finance laws do put limits on corporate freedom but this has been done with corporations and other things, including active serviceman, who are not allowed to publicly criticize the president. The court doesn't seem interested in expanding other freedoms.
