## Religious Exploration with our Young....the new RE year begins!

**August 29th** is the beginning of regular RE Programming. Classes begin at **9:30** with an ingathering ritual: lighting of the chalice and sharing of joys & concerns. The curriculum this year for our elementary school children will use a Unitarian Universalist perspective to learn some widely known Bible stories -- a few of the ones that so many of their classmates or friends might know and talk about. Our children hear these stories on the playground amidst their friends -- but they might know more about a Buddhist tradition or a yoga position than Noah and the Arc or Jesus and the miracle of the fishes. The influence of the Bible is pervasive in our culture; not just as a dominant religion but as part of the fabric of our literature and our public rhetoric. By understanding a smattering of the most widely known stories, we will spring board into our principles and emphasize how our values might be portrayed in these stories or when a universal theme is represented in the Bible as well as many of the world's religions.

Our older elementary and middle school children will work on these stories using clips from the Simpson's show and the curriculum: "The Gospel According to the Simpsons." This popular program deals with many of these same Bible stories and in many ways with the religious questions in our society. This curriculum has surprisingly witty opportunities to consider our UU faith.

**NEW THIS YEAR we begin a Nursery...**for our very youngest children where we offer opportunities for play, story time and simple activities. This program is offered at **9:30 - 10:30** and **during service until 11:30**, beginning when the children are sung out of the meeting room.

We believe that children learn best when they are having fun and are engaged in the program. We want to provide programming that connects with children in ways that they best respond and enjoy. Our program this year will continue to be activity based, with some stories, some crafts, and games. There are three class levels:

Nursery for our youngest;  
Early Elementary for our growing learners;  
Upper Elementary/Middle School.

I am looking for volunteers to teach our children. Volunteers would be responsible for one bible story and 4 sessions. All materials are provided. ### **Social Concerns and observations, by Gary Przyborski**

On a rainy Thursday evening on June 17<sup>th</sup>, Kevin Annett shared an update with us on the Canadian Holocaust and attempts to get the Catholic church to admit and abandon documented practices against the children of indigenous peoples. Now similar stories of cruelty have come to light in religious schools in other nations. Further, the Canadian government still hasn't acknowledged its involvement in the criminal events, and is allowing the Church of Canada to investigate itself, instead of pursuing a criminal investigation into the matter.

With some twenty of us in attendance, the atmosphere was intimate as people shared and questioned with searching hearts. SC would like to thank Kathy McCambridge for arranging and introducing Kevin to the group; Jill Metz of our Women's Group for providing snacks; Kathy Anderson prepared coffee and Mike Christle gave his attention to recording the event, which was streamed live, and available as an MP3-- <http://universityuus.org/d/SE2010-06-17-KevinAnnett.mp3>. In July we saw the film Protagonist, which presented 4 individuals and their experience with violence with the structure of a 5<sup>th</sup> century Euripidean tragedy. The men include a martial arts practitioner, a bank robber, a gay-evangelical preacher, and a German terrorist. I highly recommend that you either rent or buy this film; it is simply amazing. Our next Thursday meeting is scheduled for August 19<sup>th</sup>, 7-9 PM, with John Gomez speaking on Parental/Familial Child Abduction and Japan. We look forward to this talk. As a side note, these monthly meetings are set for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the month. It is hoped that other UUUS groups will take up this time to cover topics close to their hearts and minds.

SC members helped prepare HOPE Foundation's Thrift Store (Pantry Room) that previously had no insulation. R-19 vinyl coated fiberglass insulation was donated and installed by All Florida Insulation. Also, refrigerator coils were cleaned to improve their efficiency.

Stainless steel water bottles are getting close to being a hit. As of today, we've sold almost ten of them. They're great because they have an adjustable top and a foam insulator to protect your knees and keep it from sweating with cold beverages. Congrats to Kathy Anderson, Dawn Foster and Martha Kirby for tracking down the bottles.

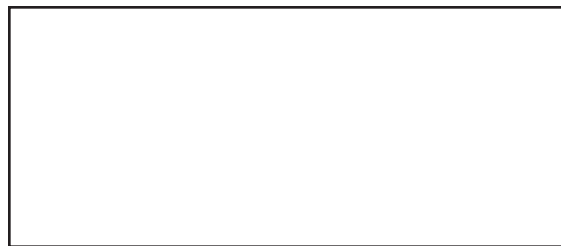
