Suggested Script:

"A group of us recently attended a program that focused on immigration. It was very informative and helped me to bring the subject into clearer view. As your constituent, it's my duty to share with you my positions on this issue so you may better represent me if and when legislation on this matter comes to a vote in the state of Florida. I am opposed to extreme immigration legislation at the state level like that recently passed by the state of Alabama. It is a myth that undocumented Latino workers were taking jobs that unemployed American citizens living in Alabama had lost. When you compare the skill sets of these two demographics, they couldn't be further apart. Furthermore, both the agricultural and construction industries have historically relied on undocumented workers to meet their seasonal demand for labor. The low pay and long hours of both of these industries have typically prevented Americans from working these jobs. The immigration legislation passed by the state of Alabama has driven these undocumented workers from the state and left a catastrophic labor shortage in both agriculture and construction. Crops are literally rotting on the vine. If similar legislation were passed here, given the role agriculture and construction play in the Florida economy, the impact would be devastating. Immigration is a federal, not state matter. I want broad, meaningful immigration reform. These undocumented workers need to be given the choice of joining the fabric of our culture or returning to their native countries. Those that stay must pay taxes and do their fair share to support the standard of living that brought them here. There are millions of undocumented immigrants in this country, the taxes they are not paying are a source of revenue that we cannot afford to do without."

It is with great sadness that we share the news of Clark Slayman's passing. His daughter, Deborah, shared this remembrance and these photos: (I apologize for the quality, they were clear when sent !)



CLARK S. SLAYMAN passed away peacefully on Nov. 16, 2011. A true Midwesterner, he was born in 1920 in Downers Grove, IL, the son of Charles and Ruth. He spent his childhood in Highland Park, MI. As a youth he enjoyed his achievements as an Eagle Scout, athlete and a member of the Civil Air Patrol. After graduating from Highland Park Junior College, he played professional hockey for the Detroit Red Wings and enlisted in the Navy in 1941, just before the Attack on Pearl Harbor. A highly decorated fighter pilot, he flew PBMs and Hellcats in the Pacific Theater.

After military service, he graduated from University of Michigan, married his beloved, Doris Laehn, and was an original "Madmen," working as an executive at BBDO. He loved the arts, a good book, political discussions, and learning. He never met a stranger and was humble and kind. He was married 59 years and had 2 children, the loves of his life, Carol Fust (Dieter) and Deborah Buzanowski (Paul). His precious grandchild, Ysonde Barrs, and great-grandchild, Hannah Barrs, are his legacy. Also left behind are many nieces and nephews, relatives and dear friends. There will

be a cremation with no funeral service. A Memorial Service will be held at a later date. Please, no flowers. Donations will be his reward, preferably to Hospice of the Comforter or Volusia Honor Air. (please see the article on Clark's trip on page 7)

They were both members of First Church and of the Short Story Group there, where many lasting friendships were formed. Honor Air escorting veterans to Washington

DAYTONA BEACH -- About 100 World War II military veterans and their escorts will be heading to Washington, D.C., on Saturday as part of the Volusia Honor Air program. This is the eighth such group from Central Florida to travel to the nation's capital through the program. They are scheduled to board a U.S. Airways charter flight at 6:26 a.m. at Daytona Beach International Airport bound for the nation's capital.



Organized by the Rotary clubs in DeLand, the daylong trip will include visits to the WWII Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Vietnam Wall, and the tomb of the unknowns. Guardian and director of veteran services



Mike White has been on several previous Honor Air flights. "It's overwhelming and emotional," White said. "Once you attend one flight, you're hooked."

The mission of the Honor Air program is to "extend appreciation and gratefulness to the heroes who showed great sacrifice, dedication and bravery during WWII," according to the group's website.

Volusia County sheriff's officials will welcome the veterans as they make their way through a dedicated security checkpoint at the airport. Following the welcome, veterans will take part in a preboarding reception inside the terminal.

A water cannon salute by Volusia County Fire Services near the runway will give the departing group a memorable send-off.

"There are so many stories..." White said. "We thank the WWII veterans. It is truly a debt that cannot be repaid. They put their life on the line for this country."

The trip is free to veterans; guardians pay \$500.

U.S. Rep John Mica, R-Winter Park, will be the host at a luncheon to honor the vets in Washington. The group will return to Daytona Beach about 8:30 p.m. and the public is encouraged to greet them.

The Volusia Honor Air Program, which is sponsored by three DeLand Rotary clubs and is free to veterans, sent out its eighth group Saturday, September 25, 2011 and is scheduled to take its next trip in May 2012, organizers said. The first Honor flight took place in 2005 when 137 veterans were taken to see the nation's war memorials. By 2010, more than 22,000 veterans overall were able to make a trip to Washington, D.C., to see the memorial through Honor Air programs nationally. An estimated 1.7 million World War II veterans are still alive and are dying at a rate of 740 a day, according to recently released figures from the U.S. Veterans Administration. It is believed there will be no more living World War II veterans by 2036.

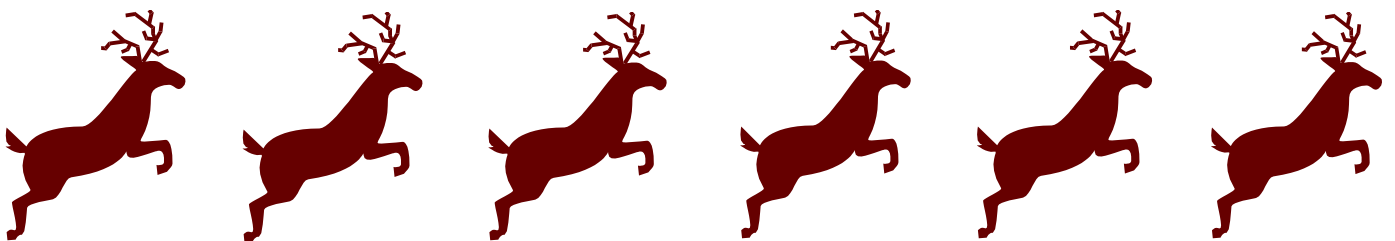

What was the role of the Soviet Union and how much of a factor was Iranian oil? 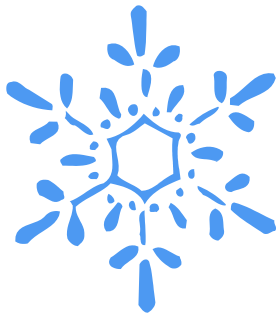
